VHPA COMMITTEE INDUCTION

(Time required – 1hr, includes reading all VHPA & SAFA document references)

Purpose

Provide Committee members with a 'starting point' in their role. This information provides a number of links that are **essential reading** for new, and ongoing committee members.

The Association

The VHPA is an incorporated association, incorporated in the state of Victoria under the <u>Associations Incorporation Reform</u> <u>Act 2012</u>. It is recognised by <u>State & Recreation Victoria</u> (SRV), as the peak State Sporting Association (SSA) for hang gliding & paragliding. VHPA is an affiliated Regional Association of the national body, Sports Aviation Federation of Australia (SAFA).

Committee of Managemement

The CoM is made up of a number of positions; 1. Some elected by SAFA members resident in Victoria, 2. A delegate from each Victorian sports club affiliated with SAFA (if the club chooses), and 3. An Affiliated Director to SAFA. The SAFA position is appointed by the CoM.

VHPA specific documents

First and foremost, the Rules of the VHPA and the accompanying Objectives are our guiding documents. Each committee member should *read every word*.

The VHPA Strategic Plan is the guiding document which outlines our strategy.
